

## Legal Status Update - Jan 21/12

CONCERNED OWNERS OF POINT AT POIPU (COPP)

While we know that many members are anxious, that the uncertainty is frustrating and everyone wants to see DRI brought to justice as soon as possible, we regret to report that the filing date for the class action lawsuit has been pushed back. We share in your desire for strong, fast action and we know that this news is as disappointing to you as it is to us. However, the leaders of COPPhave been kept fully informed, we understand why this was necessary, and that there are good reasons for the delay. Lawsuits are complicated and much hard work is being done behind the scenes by the lawyers. Many helpful documents and stories have been and are being uncovered daily and all are being carefully reviewed. From the start, it is important that we be thorough, complete, accurate and strong rather than rush just because DRI gave us a ridiculously short time to act. While we would like to share more with you, we must be very careful about what we say (they're watching). We can say that we, the leaders of COPP, remain united and committed to seeing DRI brought to justice. We can also say that, based on all the emails we have received, there are many, many members who completely agree and who remain united and strong with us.

Many of you have asked whether you should pay the outrageous special assessment by January 31. Many members have paid under protest in order to avoid a negative report to a credit bureau. They did this because they had a trip already planned and had tickets in hand, etc.. However, they remain firmly committed to seeing that justice prevails. We have heard that some members simply cannot afford to pay, or may have paid in order to give up their deeds. That is truly unfortunate and wrong. Others apparently will refuse to pay because they believe that the assessment is wrong and illegal. Each member must make their own decision based on their individual situation and circumstance. Whatever that may be, we are committed to seeking justice for all.

We thank you for your many, many supportive emails. Due to their high volume and the other demands on the time of the volunteer leadership, we have not always been able to respond as quickly as we would like. We appreciate your patience and understanding. Also, future emails and correspondence sent by COPP, LLC, will no longer contain the names of its members due to possible threat of legal action.

Our cause is just and our commitment remains strong. We ask for your continued patience with the legal process and firmly believe that it will be rewarded.
